Dominic Furniss studied medicine at Trinity College, Cambridge, He then moved and Christ Church, Oxford. Following graduation, he undertook basic surgical training in London, before undertaking higher surgical training in Plastic Surgery in Stoke Mandeville and Oxford. His clinical interests are in the fields of hand surgery, and supermicrosurgery for the treatment of lymphoedema. He has undertaken Fellowship training in Supermicrosurgery for Lymphoedema at the University of Tokyo, Japan, under the guidance of Professor Isao Koshima and Dr Makoto Mihara – pioneers of supermicrosurgery for lymphoedema. Here, he was trained by these experts in the assessment, investigation, and surgical management of lymphoedema. He is a member of the British Lymphology Society.

LOCAL ANAESTHESIA UPDATE

Speaker Dr Jean Mooney

AIMS

- To update the Podiatrist in the safe, effective and efficient administration and use of local anaesthetic and emergency drugs

OBJECTIVES

- To revise the basic anatomy and physiology of the nervous system, especially of the lower limb and foot
- To review the range of the POM drugs that can be used to achieve local analgesia, and treat anaphylactic shock
- To review the various techniques used to achieve LA in the lower limb and foot
- To understand the principles of patient selection for LA
- To be able to diagnose, recognise and treat clinical emergencies arising with the use of LA, including patient collapse
- To endorse effective and legal practice: control of infection, informed consent, and other legal/ethical issues

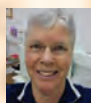
