Maria Mousley, BSc, MSc, MChs.

Maria Mousley, is consultant podiatrist, diabetes and tissue viability, Northamptonshire PCT. Maria Mousley qualified from Birmingham School in 1991. Her special interest is early identification of the foot at risk with appropriate referral pathways, and tissue viability. Maria has provided education on these and other topics to GPs, nursing and podiatry colleagues. She has lectured at University of Hertford and Nene University on MSc courses.

Jane E Greenwood, MChS, DPodM, DFHom (Pod)

Jane graduated as a Podiatrist from Huddersfield University in 1987. During 2001, she qualified as a Licenced Associate of the Faculty of Homeopathy. In 2009, she was successful at the Diplome level examinations gaining a distinction from the advanced training at the Royal London Homeopathic Hospital. Recently, she undertook foundation training to become a DESMOND (Diabetes Education and Self Management for Ongoing and Newly Diagnosed) educator, and is currently involved in an 8 month data collection project run by the Faculty of Homeopathy. In addition, working on a consultancy basis she accepts referrals for her homeopathic podiatric domiciliary private practice, and offers specialist advice on homeopathic podiatry in a freelance capacity.

Dawn Gawthorpe, RGN, RMN, RNT, Ba (Hons), MA, PGCE (HE)

Dawn has predominantly developed her clinical expertise in the field of Neurosurgical nursing spanning some twenty years. Three years later he set-up the first European cadaver training for UK Podiatric Surgeons. Since then he has affirmed collaborative links to both the University of Southampton and Manchester. Moreover, in 2008 he was the first Podiatric surgeon to host ERASMUS podiatry students from the prestigious Karolinska Institute.

Mr. Greg Quinn, FCPodS, Podiatric Surgeon

After graduating in 1994 from Salford School of Podiatry, Greg worked within the NHS in Derbyshire for over 10 years, establishing a podiatric surgery department to work alongside diabetes, orthopaedic and rheumatology support clinics. After his appointment as a Fellow of the Surgical Faculty of the Society of Chiropodists & Podiatrists and serving on the Education and Examinations Committee, he left Chesterfield Royal Hospital to work at Holywell Healthcare and was appointed as a Consultant to the Ministry of Defence Regional Rehabilitation Unit at Aldershot, Tidworth and ATR Pirbright. He is a co-founder of Talar Made Ltd. and a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, Manufacturers and Commerce. He has recently taken a break from clinical practice to complete his research into the genetic inheritance of foot morphology and has worked with many University research colleagues outside of the clinical environment to achieve this.

Sasha Marie BSc, MChs

Sasha Marie graduated from Southampton in 2006. She initially worked in private practice but is currently working as a lecturer in Podiatry at Birmingham Metropolitan College on the BSc programme. She teaches on the Pathology module and is the Clinical Manager of the 18 chair clinic. She is currently finishing her MSc in Podiatry and Education.
